Critical Thinking

Critical thinking is a crucial skill for today's modern world and we should be encouraging a child's wonder, awe and imagination.

Get them asking questions... ask questions of them.... Challenge and ignite the curiosity and creativity that seems to dim as they get older.

Inquiry learning at St Aidan's stimulates a search for new knowledge and skills. It needs to be consistent and ongoing and is a crucial skill for their future!

Why My Child's Teacher Was Not In Class Today?

Occasionally, teachers are away There are many reasons for this including work entitlements, such as sick days, long service leave or carers days, etc. Sometimes teachers attend Professional Learning courses to assist students with their learning needs or are possibly attending Professional Learning opportunities on the school site.

Maybe the teachers are on site but not in class because they are collecting data about your child, through Maths interviews, running records of their reading or assessments to diagnose their letter or number knowledge in the infants classes. Occasionally, teachers might be asked to attend sporting carnivals and supervise teams.

However, the child's learning program continues as normal since programs are written collaboratively and relief teachers

What can you do at home to support your child at home?

COUNT WITH YOUR CHILD EVERY NIGHT!

It is very important that your child counts every night. Maths goals went home on Monday which show what they are working on in class.

Your child may be working on counting forwards and backwards, skip counting by 2s, 5s, 10s or counting money as an example.

Research suggests that for students to learn a new skill they need 200 hits- 200 opportunities to practice this skill. So get counting!

Maths words of the week

Collection: A group of objects that students count or manipulate.

More and Less: Instead of using the language "the number before and after" we use the language "more and less".

For example

What is the number 1 more than 10?


What is the number 1 less than 93?




