We also discussed MATHS and Project Based learning (PBL) through a house building activity. We investigated how maths concepts and understandings can be integrated creatively into tasks to fully engage students and assist their deeper learning.

Why is this day special to Australians?


At 11 am on 11 November, 1918 the guns of the Western Front fell silent after more than four years of continuous warfare.

> The 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month attained a special significance in the post-war years.

The moment when hostilities ceased on the Western Front became universally associated with the remembrance of those who had died in war.

This first modern world conflict had brought about the mobilisation of over 70 million people and left between 9 and 13 million dead, perhaps as many as one-third of them with no known grave. The allied nations chose this day and time for the commemoration of their war dead. An horrific event.

Being on Time

Attendance is not just about being at school but also about being on time. Being late 5 minutes a day equals 25 minutes over a week, 250 minutes a term or 4 hours per term, or the equivalent of 3-4 days per year and over the schooling years is equivalent to one whole term of missed learning time. When a student arrives late they have often missed the introduction to a lesson and they have missed time socialising with their peers.






