


Catherine McAuley is now accepting enrolments for Year 7 2017.

Thank you to Mr Julius for giving up his time to prepare the students and to Mrs Provest and Mr and Mrs Warwick-Smith who acted as officials on the day.

On Thursday I was thrilled to judge the year six 'Voice of Youth' St Aidan's finals. The students who won our school competition were Marta Abicic and Christina Abi Chemouni with Ida-Laura Ioane as runner up. 


NUMERACY NEWS

A number line is a line where numbers are marked at different points. The line could start at zero or at a particular number.

Number lines are used in the classroom to help students understand the value of numbers and where they fit in relation to different numbers.



As students develop their understanding of numbers, they are encouraged to place the numbers on an empty number line.



It is important when students place numbers on an empty number line that they explain why they have chosen to place a number at a particular point.

Using number lines both empty or with numbers at home will allow your child to consolidate their understanding of numbers and place value.

In the next newsletter I will continue to explore place value and provide examples of how you can support numeracy development at home.
