Reading

How can you help your child in reading?

- Show your child that you value reading by reading whenever you can.
- Encourage a positive attitude to books.
- Provide a variety of texts for your child to read to you, eg stories, comics, poems, plays, cartoons, reference books, magazines, children's recipe books.
- Encourage your child to borrow books from the library.
- Point out words on street signs, packets and labels.
- Encourage your child to predict what a book is about from the cover and illustrations.





Students Leaving (Moving to a different primary school)

School Fee Management Policy Section 5.7c (Credit/Refunds and Notice Period)

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated in the same manner as above refer "Billing - Pro Rata Period" where leaving Year K to 11 Students pay fees based on a pro-rata 40 week year and Year 12 Students pay fees based on a pro-rata 30 week year. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment, that is, the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

The requirement for a terms notice (10 school weeks) is recognition by the family of the commitment to assist with funding of the School by having their child take a place that could have been offered to another family. Unless the student is present for the August census or the student is able to be replaced mid-year, which is unlikely, the loss of the student will most certainly result in the loss of significant government funding. Thus a term notice provides the school with an opportunity to replace the student within the next term. Special circumstances that would warrant 6 weeks' notice include move moving due to employment transfer or sale of house.





Enrolments and interviews for Kindergarten 2018 are now well underway. Various parent meetings and orientation days for students will take place in terms 3 and 4.


At the farm we saw lots of different animals. We saw chickens, goats, sheep, horses, a camel and some baby piglets, just to name a few

Being on Time

Attendance is not just about being at school but also about being on time. Being late 5 minutes a day equals 25 minutes over a week, 250 minutes a term or 4 hours per term, or the equivalent of 3 ¼ days per year and over the schooling years is equivalent to one whole term of missed learning time. When a student arrives late they have often missed the introduction to a lesson and they've missed time socialising with their peers.

Diocesan schools is 90%




Later on in Term 3 there will be an Infants athletics carnival for those students in Kindergarten, Year One and Year Two. Parents are encouraged to come along to support all the students.

MATHEMATICS AT ST AIDAN'S.

Mathematics is taught at St Aidan's every day for 60 minutes. Within each lesson students engage in a warm up activity, a rich/open ended task and reflection time.


WARM UP (5-10 minutes)

This is a time where students engage in short sharp maths games or activities that focus on numbers and counting collections (objects). Warm up activities should encourage students to practise skills they have learnt around counting collections, place value, addition and subtraction or multiplication and division.

Some examples



Counting with a bead string



Number busting



Showing a collection using different materials.

RICH OPEN ENDED TASK: (30-40 minutes)

During this time students are engaged in a rich or open ended Maths task. Students are involved in thinking and doing the Mathematics.

RICH TASK: The maths problem has one answer, however many different ways of solving the problem.

OPEN ENDED TASK: The maths problem, has many answers and many different ways of solving the problem.

Some examples

RICH TASK

Gabby is opening a savings account with \$200.

The bank pays 5% interest on the balance each year and charges \$5 fees at the end of each year.

If she doesn't do anything else with her account, what will the balance be after five years?




OPEN ENDED TASK


I saw 12 legs walk into the farm paddock. How many animals did I see? What animals did I see?



REFLECTION: (10-15 minutes)

This is the main teaching time of the lesson. Teachers and students reflect on their learning for the day. During this time the teacher may teach a particular skill from the lesson or students may share strategies with the class that worked well. Students could use the strategies taught the next day.





Parent Dictionary

Mathematical language explained for Parents

Array: A group of objects in the shape of a rectangle. Arrays are used by students to help solve multiplication and division problems. For example 6x3= 18.



Bead String: (Pictured above) A string used during Mathematics that holds 120 beads (in groups of ten). Bead strings are used in Mathematics to assist students to count, represent different numbers and add and subtract different collections.

Bead Kebab: A kebab stick that holds 20 beads (in groups of 5). Students use these sticks in Mathematics to assist them to count, represent smaller numbers (including fractions) and add/subtract small collections.



Strategies: Different ways students can solve mathematical problems. For example using 'friends of ten'.
