This only increases their desire to learn and to feel part of this great school.


Dates Coming Up

The proposed changes to afternoon dismissal of students has been thoroughly discussed by groups of parents, teachers and others to see if it is safe, viable and a way of addressing the traffic issues in the area at 2:30pm to 3:15pm each afternoon.

We are aiming to start these procedures from Monday, September 12th onwards so that it will have a full 2 weeks before the holiday break to ensure it works safely.

Students will also be well informed and practised before and on the day of the 12th September.

PARENTS HAVE SEVERAL CHOICES-

- 1. Spencer Street and other parking areas will still operate with students escorted across crossings as normal
- 2. Parents may want to pick up their child(ren) in the playground. They will now enter through the gate used by students and families of a morning.
- 3. Vans now enter the site and drive straight to the shelter area outside Year 3 where students will be waiting.
- 4. Cars enter from Rooty Hill Road North also (left turn into the site). They move in the direction of the arrows on the diagram. Students will be waiting on the green turf areas. If congestion builds, there are plenty of parking spaces in the bottom area near the parish buildings.

OTHER POINTS-

• **Family names** will be displayed in the car windows to assist in the efficient movement of students to cars. The signs will be produced by the school office. We will need to know who intends using the school car park system of an afternoon. Please email the school email address on this newsletter.

- Gates open at 2:30 pm on Rooty Hill Road North to enable classes to do sport or other activities up to this time.
- After school care students will move along the ramp to the hall shelter area where they will be collected by the supervisors. Procedures have been discussed with the supervisors to ensure safe movement off the school site.



PARENT MEETING 23/8 UPDATE




Come dressed in your brightest fluro gear, enjoy great music, win some prizes and dance the night away.

Pedestrian Safety



Many of our students at St Aidan's walk to and from school each day. Therefore, parents are reminded to slow down and watch carefully for students who may not be concentrating on keeping safe. Once a parent and or child enter a pedestrian crossing the driver is expected to stop to allow the safe crossing of those concerned. Most

parents and local traffic do follow the rules and slow down and allow pedestrians to cross. Children under the age of seven must hold an adults hand to cross the road. Please remind your children they must stay close to you around traffic and not run ahead.

Helping children with writing:

Provide a suitable place for children to write.

A quiet corner is best, if possible. If not, any flat surface with elbow room, a comfortable chair, and a good light will do.

Give children, and encourage others to give, the gifts associated with writing: pens of several kinds, pencils of appropriate size and hardness, a desk lamp, pads of paper, stationery, envelopes, even stamps, a booklet for a diary or daily journal, a dictionary appropriate to children's age and needs.

Most dictionary use is for checking spelling, but a good dictionary contains fascinating information on word origins, synonyms, pronunciation, and so forth, a thesaurus for older children. This will help in the search for the "right" word.
