

#### School Attendance

St Aidan's follows the Parramatta Diocesan guidelines in regards to attendance. School attendance is compulsory for every school age student.

If your child is away a note explaining the absence is required. Skoolbag Ap 'eforms' provides an absentee form for parents to complete and submit via the Ap. There is also provision on our school website <a href="https://www.staidansrootyhill.catholic.edu.au">www.staidansrootyhill.catholic.edu.au</a> for absentee notes to be completed and then emailed to the school.

The following information from the Catholic Education Office Parramatta also gives some key facts of why attendance every day is so important to student learning. If you have any questions about student attendance please contact the school.

#### **Key Facts About School Attendance**

- Attendance affects academic achievement. Every day of attendance contributes towards a child's learning and enhances academic achievement.
- Attendance has a strong relationship with student outcomes as measured by NAPLAN scores. Each percentage point increase in attendance is related to higher student outcomes by an average of 2-3 NAPLAN scale score points in numeracy, reading, spelling, writing and grammar & punctuation.

- Absence from school is associated with academic achievement in the current year as well as future years
- If children do not attend school regularly they miss out on the chance to build a good attendance habit
- Being absent for one day of school each fortnight (two days a month) adds up to missing more than a year of learning over 10 years. This is called school absenteeism
- Sporadic absences affect academic achievement as much as consecutive days
- School attendance patterns are established early in kindergarten and year one.

#### Numeracy News

The numeracy block at St Aidan's consists of a sixty minute lesson each day. This lesson is broken into three parts: warm up, rich open-ended task and reflection.



**WARM UP** 10-15 minutes: Students engage in games or activities involving number concepts (counting, place value, addition and subtraction or multiplication and division).

RICH OPEN-ENDED TASK 30-40 minutes: Students are presented with a mathematical task that is rich, real and relevant. The task can involve multiple answers and allows the students to use materials and mental strategies to solve the problem.

**REFLECTION** 10-15 minutes: Students share their mathematical thinking with the teacher and their peers, reflect on their own learning, ask questions and set goals for the next lesson.

More information about the numeracy block will be addressed in future newsletters and parent meetings.
