The use of the E-A scale in reports

Teachers have collected many forms of assessment on each student before giving a grade.

Assessment starts at the beginning of the year and is continuous throughout the year.

The E grade indicated the student required help to complete grade appropriate tasks. The D grade indicates the student demonstrated basic understanding of the tasks. The C grade indicates the student demonstrated sound understanding of the tasks. The B grade indicates the student demonstrated excellent understanding of the tasks. The A grade indicates the student demonstrated outstanding understanding of the tasks.

It is important to note here that a C grade is where most students will be in the grade.

This term our semester reports will have a general comment only. The comments will include a literacy, numeracy, religious education and an overall comment. Staff have 500 character count only including commas and full stops. St Aidan's did ask for an increase to the character count however CEDP are unable to do this. Therefore more detail and comments are part of the family (student/parent) conference held in the last week of term.

LITERACY CONTINUUM

Our parent forum was held last week with workshops in both literacy and numeracy. As part of that discussion, parents viewed the literacy continuum which are the benchmarks NSW schools are using as a guide for student progress. St Aidan's literacy goal is specifically around comprehension.

The student's placement on the literacy continuum for Aspects of Writing, Vocabulary and Comprehension will be discussed and given to parents at the family conferences in Week 10 this term.

READING

Reading should be enjoyable for you and your child. If your child becomes distressed or loses interest when reading at home, take a break from reading and try again later. All children, regardless of age, like to be read to. Make a special time whenever possible for reading with your child away from interruptions.

Encouraging the behaviour you want in your child

CREATIVE ARTS - TERM 2 - DRAMA

This term St Aidan's have been enjoying drama. Drama involves students making, performing and appreciating through various roles, dramatic contexts, elements and forms. The students have developed skills in role-playing, movement, improvisation, story-telling, mime, puppetry video drama, play-building and Reader's Theatre.



Kindergarten have been making dinosaurs and taking on roles to explore familiar and imagined situations. The class used their dinosaurs to come up with stories and dramatic play using puppets.

Stage 1

Year 1 and Year 2 were introduced to mime. Children used mime to perform using facial expression, body language and non-verbal vocalisation to communicate. They also used props and costumes, musical instruments to perform Nursery Rhymes.



Stage 2

Years 3 and 4 used warm-ups before activing out role plays and Reader's Theatre. Danny in the Toy Box involved community workers and students used costumes and worked as a team creating an incident involving a doctor, policeman, nurse and fire fighter.

Stage 3

Years 5 and 6 explored improvisation, movement, mime, story-telling in their drama and were encouraged to adopt roles and move into the imagined reality of the Fairy-Tale world. The stories were brought to life by the use of voice, gesture, facial expression, body position, pace and sound effects.

Numeracy News

Multiplication and Division across K-6.

Over the past few weeks students across K-6 have engaged in different Multiplication and Division tasks as part of the school Mathematics goal for 2017.

Below are examples of tasks that students from K-6 worked on.

Kindergarten	12 cookies are shared equally between 3 friends. How many cookies did each person get?
Year 1 and 2	36 cookies are shared into lunch bags. In each bag there were 3 cookies. How many bags will I need?
Year 3 and 4	135 cookies are shared into lunch bags. In each bag there are 3 cookies. How many bags will I need?
Year 5 and 6	135 cookies are shared in boxes. In each box there are 9 cookies. How many boxes will I need?

During these tasks students were encouraged to use materials or use what they know to solve the problem, without counting or sharing by Is.

They were also encouraged to explain how they solved the problem.

Students were then further challenged by finding different ways to reach the answer or were given a larger amount of cookies to work with.

Being on Time

Attendance is not just about being at school but also about being on time. Being late 5 minutes a day equals 25 minutes over a week, 250 minutes a term or 4 hours per term, or the equivalent of 3 ¼ days per year and over the schooling years is equivalent to one whole term of missed learning time. When a student arrives late they have often missed the introduction to a lesson and they've missed time socialising with their peers.


EVERY LEARNER, EVERY DAY is our school slogan for 2017. It is our combined responsibility to have our children at school every day and on time.






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
