If we are to achieve the best possible learning outcomes for our students then each of us; students, parents and staff must invest time and effort into making this happen.

Thank you parents for your tremendous support with the recent Mathematics Assessment Interviews (MAI's). The data obtained from these interviews will be very useful to teachers for planning class numeracy sessions this term. All interviews should be completed by the end of week two. There has been excellent use of the school 'app' and it is hoped that parents will continue to make use of the 'app' to keep up to date with school happenings this year.

Parent/teacher interviews will be held in week ten of this term and again at the end of term two. Outside of these set times parents are encouraged to arrange to meet with teachers as the need arises. It is the right of every parent to seek information about their child's learning.

If you wish to meet with teachers at any time about any issue please contact the school office to make an appointment. By arranging a specific time teachers are able to prepare for the meeting. It is not acceptable for parents/teachers to be discussing important issues on assembly lines or on the play-ground.

Parents are reminded about the following

- The importance of punctuality each morning and afternoon. The morning bell is rung at 8.40am. Please make sure your children are in the play-ground before this time each day as many minutes of learning are lost through children arriving late to school. Similarly parents are requested to be 'on time' to collect their children at the end of the day. Please notify the school office if for any reason you will be late collecting your child from school.
- The appropriate area for parents waiting. Parents are welcome to come into the playground before and after school. However, for reasons of child protection, there are designated areas for parents. Before school parents are asked to sit on the silver seats near the year four learning space. After school parents are asked to wait on the silver seats at the bottom of the playground near year three. Your children are our prime concern and therefore teachers need to have clear vision of them in order to supervise effectively before and after school.
- Safe driving around the school. Parents are asked to keep to the 40kph speed limit and take care at all times when driving near the school. There is very limited parking at the front of the school and when parents are running late in the mornings the build-up of traffic at the two school crossings is extremely dangerous. The school cares about YOUR children. Please parents, show the same care.
- St Aidan's high expectations with regard to uniform and grooming. We do not and will not apologise for setting high standards nor do we apologise for insisting that these expectations are met. Please be reminded of the following
- O hair that reaches the shoulder is tied back and fixed with a bottle green or gold ribbon or scrunchy
- O clippered hair it be no shorter than a number two
- O undercuts, tracks, tails, mohawks, mullets or any other hairstyle that is out of the ordinary is not permitted.
- O children wear a minimum of jewellery. They are only to wear one pair of earrings and for safety reasons these are to be studs not hooped earrings.
- O children do not wear makeup and nail polish to school.
- O the correct uniform is to be worn at all times
- O sports shoes are to be mainly white. Brightly coloured sports shoes ARE NOT to be worn.
- O parents will be contacted regarding breaches of our expectations. Much angst can be avoided by people attending to the seemingly 'little' things and simply complying with the school's policies.

If you are unsure about any of the school's policies please contact myself or Mrs Leahy, Assistant Principal

In order to touch base with parents and clarify any questions you may have about school I invite you to meet me for 'coffee and a chat'. This will take place on Wednesday 4th March from 1.50-2.45 in the school library. Further details will be available closer to the date.

I ask that you take note of the term dates over the page and keep these in a prominent place at home so you can keep 'up to date' with school happenings.

SPORTS AT ST AIDAN'S: WHAT DOES THAT LOOK LIKE?

I would like to you to clarify sport at St Aidan's.

St Aidan's implements the NSW Board of Studies PDHPE (Personal Development, Health and Physical Education) syllabus. This clearly states that it is **mandatory** for all primary schools to have a minimum of **one hour per week** of sport or physical activity. St Aidan's follows this direction.

The PE or sport program is skills based and includes four different areas:

- dance
- games and sport
- gymnastics
- active lifestyle

The skills are different for each grade depending on age and ability.

In addition to weekly sport, the CEDP (Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta) organises different gala days for primary students in various sports, such as:

- soccer
- netball
- basketball and others

St Aidan's enters primary teams in gala days each year. St Aidan's primary athletics carnival, cross country and infants tabloid the sports program and some children progress to the Diocesan Athletics and Cross Country.

At times parents have asked for additional sport to be offered. As the curriculum is already overloaded there is no room for additions. Government schools do not teach Religious Education therefore they have an extra 2 ½ hours each week.

Parents who require additional sports/ competition for their children are encouraged to look to local communities that offers broad array of sporting competitions.
