Numeracy News

ADDITION AND SUBTRACTION STRATEGIES

By the time children start Stage 2 (Year 3) they should be able to solve most 2 digit addition and subtraction questions in their head without relying on an algorithm.

Children are exposed to different strategies they can use to solve the questions (Place Value- Split strategy, jump strategy, bridging to the next 10 etc).

Children are encouraged to explain how they got their answer and recall the strategy they used the answer the question.

Ask your child these questions below.

15+35=	90-15=
51+11=	68+32=
85-17=	87+27=
55-32=	102-86=
67+84=	99-24=

How did they go?

It is important to continue practising these at home as it will help them to solve questions mentally and give them opportunities explain their thinking without using an algorithm.

What Mathematics will you notice, discuss and explore with your children this week?





Being on Time

Attendance is not just about being at school but also about being on time. Being late 5 minutes a day equals 25 minutes over a week, 250 minutes a term or 4 hours per term, or the equivalent of 3-4 days per year and over the schooling years is equivalent to one whole term of missed learning time. When a student arrives late they have often missed the introduction to a lesson and they have missed time socialising with their peers.

EVERY LEARNER, EVERY DAY is our school slogan for 2017. It is our combined responsibility to have our children at school every day and on time.

Attendance is a major focus for St Aidan's this year.

Week 2 attendance level is 78.8%

Week 3 attendance level is 80.4%

Week 4 attendance level is 78.9%

Attendance level target for all Diocesan schools is 90%






