

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REFLECTION

The Fourth discourse dealt with the founding and instructing of ‘The Church’ by Jesus (chapter eighteen). Only in Matthew’s gospel was ‘Church’ mentioned.

Jesus called on Peter to lead and take charge of the mission of building the Church. Jesus said, “You are Peter, and upon this rock, I will build my church. . . I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven.” (Mt 16:18-19) The Pope is the successor of Peter, who was given the authority to preach, lead and to forgive sins. Jesus also told Peter and the others that greatness did not come in being served, but in serving others.

The Fifth discourse dealt with the final judgment- *Eschatology* (the end time). (Chapters twenty-four to twenty-five) Matthew wrote of the end of the Temple, the end of the world, and the divine judgment on the last day. The end of the Temple meant the severance of Jewish ties between Christians and Jews.

In order to keep alive the faith of his Christian-Jews, Matthew once again in his final chapters linked back to the Old Testament to *Daniel 7-8* with *apocalyptic* (revelation) language. He wrote of ongoing war between good and evil; God being in charge during times of trial and that his disciples should remain faithful and always be prepared for God’s return.

EXPLANATION OF SYLLABUS

History

- ◆ Students investigate their personal, family and community history.
- ◆ They develop understanding of Australia’s Indigenous and colonial history and how Australia became a nation.
- ◆ Students learn about historical concepts, such as viewing an historical event from a different point of view, and historical skills, such as using historical sources for an investigation.

In addition to subject-based content, all syllabuses address important contemporary themes and general capabilities as students prepare to live and work successfully in the 21st century. These include Australian curriculum cross-curriculum priorities and general capabilities, and other learning across the curriculum areas identified by the Board of Studies.

LITERACY MATTERS

Part of reading for each student is home reading each night. Teachers send home readers that students have read before they go home. This may mean they are what we call an ‘easy’ or ‘familiar’ read. The purpose is to get your child confident and reading fluently or as the children will say “reading like we are talking.”

Reading and writing requires constant practice in order to improve. Parents can help by encouraging their child to practice these each day. Therefore, the experience with reading and writing needs to be positive. Set aside time where you can talk to your child about their reading and writing. Ask them what the book they read was about and what the characters did in the story. Ask them to write about the book.

NUMERACY NEWS

As we have explored this term, measurement needs to be taught in a variety of practical situations for children to deeply understand.

Children learn about time by being exposed to the language of time (yesterday, today) and by comparing the time it takes to complete different activities. Children then move to using both analog and digital clocks to help them tell the time.

What can you do at home to develop your child’s understanding of time?

- ◆ Look for different clocks around the house. Ask your child if they are analog or digital.
- ◆ Record special events on the calendar and talk about how many days, weeks or months until the event.
- ◆ Talk about events in terms of time. For example, it will take me two minutes to make toast.

When learning about time, children need to **notice**, **discuss** and **explore** the mathematics around them. This will challenge their thinking about time and develop their estimation skills.

In the next newsletter I will look at the important of mental computation and the new Mathematics Curriculum to be implemented in 2015.

What Mathematics will you **notice**, **discuss** and **explore** with your child this week?
