What do you think?

DOES THE 'CARROT AND STICK' MODEL ACHIEVE DESIRED CHANGES IN ATTITUDE AND BEHAVIOUR??

Most schools and families tend to use a behaviour management system of 'if you do this (eg misbehave or maybe do the right thing), you will get that....'

'Carrots' might include stickers, awards, rewards, prizes, certificates, table points competition, brag tags, special treats, etc and are used extensively in schools to provide incentives for better performance.



Once achieved, the question ariseswhat is the next "thing" or 'carrot' to give a further boost to changes in behaviour and attitude? And the time after that? ...and after that?

At what point does the 'carrot' lose its impact and the student (or your child) just does not care about getting the carrot? It loses its meaning and momentum.



'Sticks' might include detention (eg send them to their room), loss of privileges, withholding something like use of an iPad or TV, loss of playtime, etc.

We use these 'disincentives' to try to discourage certain behaviours and encourage children not to do the same poor behaviour again.... but often they do....

Combine the two (carrot and stick) and you get.....?



The 'carrots and sticks' are often only short term changes or solutions which work best with younger children. High schools for example do not usually give students stickers to acknowledge their efforts but certainly try to give recognition and affirmation in other ways. Students move past this as they grow...

At St Aidan's, we use various classroom based strategies to give incentive and recognition to students for performing well. We occasionally also use 'disincentives' as well.

However, for more <u>permanent positive changes to behaviour and attitudes to learning</u>, we want our students to have an intrinsic or inner desire to do their very best <u>AT ALL TIMES</u> Now this is a bit harder to achieve....

This permanent positive behaviour is however, the ultimate desired result of what we do at St Aidan's. We want our students to be self-motivated, keen and eager to learn new things, be passionate and inspired by new learning tasks and look forward to the challenges ahead.

Uniform Survey

Thank you to our St Aidan's families for your returned surveys. The results were:

Choice #1: 73 responses
Improve the present sports uniform
with better quality fabrics and design

Choice #2: 42 responses
Create a new uniform & sports uniform
with new colours

Choice #3: 21 responses
Create a new uniform/ sports uniform
with the present colours

We have 280 families and 136 replies. No doubt some families have their last child in the upper grades and the decision will not impact them.

However, the majority have favoured to simply improve the present sports uniform, only with better quality fabrics and design.

Our parent committee will now meet with Lowes to see what they have to offer in this regard. Timing is getting tight in preparation for 2018. We will get back to the community as soon as possible.

Child Protection



Students have received an attendance sheet that is stamped each week if they have been at school. The children receive a sticker if they have been at school with 100% attendance after five weeks and a certificate at the end of the term for 100% attendance.

Parents can help their child's attendance by:

- · Being firm. Send your child to school every day unless they are sick
- · Develop good sleep and morning routines
- · Schedule appointments for after school
- Avoid taking holidays during school terms...their education is extremely important!

Reading

Continuing on from last week, we are focusing on students reading for pleasure and will highlight eLibraries.

An eLibrary or electronic library is a collection of books, journals, magazines etc that can be accessed digitally without leaving your lounge room.

Did you know?

Many council libraries, like Blacktown City Library and Penrith City Library, grant access to people with library cards to borrow ebooks just like normal library books. You don't have to leave home to borrow or to return them. Each library has a webpage which includes details about APPs to use for iPads, tablets, phones or computers.

Our diocese also provides an ebook service for students. Parramatta Diocesan K-12 Student eLibrary

From school, access is available from the ePortal and from home it is accessible from Student Net.

What to submit.

Conditions of entry

- Storytellers may be filmed performing either in front of a live audience or directly to the camera
- Filming should show the performer in a full body or half body shot so that the arms and hands are visible
- Stories are to be told, not read
- The story is to be no longer than 6 minutes
- Consideration should be given to pace and tone of voice, expression and gesture
- Please send your video file on a USB stick to The Australian Storytelling Guild (NSW)


Deadline All entries must be postmarked by Friday 19th May 2017 or earlier

Judging The quality of the performance will be judged, not the quality of the video or filming technique

- Finalists will be notified by 2nd June 2017
- Finalists will be invited to present their story at the Sydney Storytelling Conference family concert June 17th 2017
- All participants will receive a certificate of participation via email.

Literacy at St Aidan's



PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

To improve literacy amongst our students we encourage them to read every night. One way is through the Premier's Reading Challenge in which St Aidan's is participating. The Reading Challenge promoted by the NSW Premier, began on March 6th and closes August 25th. It is open to students from K-9. Children in K-2 are encouraged to read 30 books over the 5 months. 25 books to be chosen from the reading lists and 5 books that are free choice. Children in 3-9 are encouraged to read 20 books over the 5 months. 15 books to be chosen from the reading lists and 5 books that are free choice.

In the coming weeks kinder students will come home with their login. For those children who have previously participated in the Challenge their login will be the same. If they don't remember their login please advise their teacher. They can log their reading books at home or at school.



Numeracy News

ADDITION AND SUBTRACTION GROWTH POINTS



0	Not yet able to combine and count two collections of objects.
1	I can count all the objects to find the total of the two collections.
2	I can count on from one number to find the total of the two collections.
3	I can use appropriate strategies to solve subtraction problems (count up to, count back from).
4	I can use basic strategies like friends of ten, doubles, adding ten to solve addition and subtraction problems.
5	I can use strategies like adding 9 and near doubles to solve addition and subtraction problems.
6	I can solve multi digit addition and subtraction problems mentally using appropriate strategies.
7	I can add and subtract fractions and decimals.

How can I support my child with their addition and subtraction goal?

- Provide your child with opportunities to combine and count/separate and count groups of objects.
- Encourage your child to count on from one collection of objects, rather than counting them all. (Hiding one collection of objects will help them to count on).
- Encourage your child to solve all addition and subtraction problems mentally, before using an algorithm.
- Allow your child to add and subtract money. Children need experience adding money (coins and notes) together and working out the change.

In the next newsletter I will explore the multiplication and division growth points and share some more practical ideas.

On Friday the 7th of April, St Aidan's will be celebrating our wonderful grandparents with a special whole-school mass.




